**CREEK LORE** is a community based art project by Laura Wills that focuses on First Creek between Marryatville High School and Tusmore Park. Through a series of guided walks, the public is invited to engage with the local environment and hear stories of the creek as it flows through public and private land.

Creek Lore has gathered **SPECIAL GUEST SPEAKERS** including a wild lawyer, local and indigenous artists, two community choirs, local land owners and a forager to actively share ideas and experiences of First Creek, plus speak about its future. Laura Wills has also worked in collaboration with a group of Marryatville High School students to create a series of temporary installations made up from the flotsam and jetsam as well as local natural materials found along the creek.

**PROJECTS OF THE EVERYDAY** is a new initiative from OSCA. It brings together innovative South Australian artists in a series of long term residencies to create participatory art projects in the suburb where they live. Creek Lore is the first work in this series.
